Environmental Policy

Pickup & Son Ltd recognises that it has a legal and moral responsibility to manage its activities in such a way so as to limit or reduce any detrimental impacts on the environment by virtue of its operations.

To this end Pickup & Son Ltd will adopt a philosophy of ‘beyond minimum compliance’ at all levels of its operations to ensure both the prevention of pollution and the minimising of environmental disruption as far possible.

This will involve:

- The assessment of the environmental aspects and impacts of any maintenance activity prior to its commencement
- Ensuring that procurements are made from the most sustainable supplier sources
- Ensuring that all plant and vehicles are maintained in accordance with manufacturers’ recommendations to prevent undue or excessive emissions and hence pollution
- Ensuring that vehicle movements, and resulting emissions, are limited to those necessary for the planned activities
- Ensuring that applications of herbicides or other agents are optimised so as to minimise any adverse or unintended impact on the wider environment
- Wherever possible, recycling or otherwise utilising the waste arising from its maintenance operations so as to minimise or eliminate waste sent to landfill
- Providing and maintaining spillage containment equipment to ensure that accidental leakage of harmful substances will not enter the natural environment
- The periodic review of environmental legislation and any other regulations to which the organisation’s activities are subject, to ensure continued compliance.

Protecting the environment not only makes good commercial sense but is also an investment in our future, both short term and long term. Pickup & Son Ltd is therefore firmly committed to adopting this policy as a means to achieving this.

The management communicates this policy, and the means by which it is implemented through its operations, to all of its employees to ensure that they are kept aware of the environmental implications of their day to day work.

This policy is facilitated through the implementation of an environmental management system that meets the requirements of ISO 14001:2004 and which is reviewed periodically to ensure its continued effectiveness.
